







The Whittiers / STEEL, Danielle


The wrong sister / PALMER, Fiona


A brief affair / MILLER, Alex


Broad River station / MCDONALD, Fleur


Moonlight road / CARR, Robyn


Clive Cussler's Hellburner / MADEN, Mike


Headcase / HEATH, Jack


Hunting time / DEAVER, Jeffery


The choice / ROBERTS, Nora


Clarke / THROSBY, Holly


Day's end / DISHER, Garry


Desert star / CONNELLY, Michael


East of Alice / SEATON, Annie


The furies: two Charlie Parker novels / CONNOLLY, John


Going rogue / EVANOVICH, Janet


The hunt / KELLERMAN, Faye


Larch Tree Lane / JACOBS, Anna


Livid / CORNWELL, Patricia






The serpent in heaven / HARRIS, Charlaine


Spirit of the season / MICHAELS, Fern


The violence / DAWSON, Delilah S.


What moves the dead / KINGFISHER, T.


Finders keepers / KING, Stephen
